African Elephant



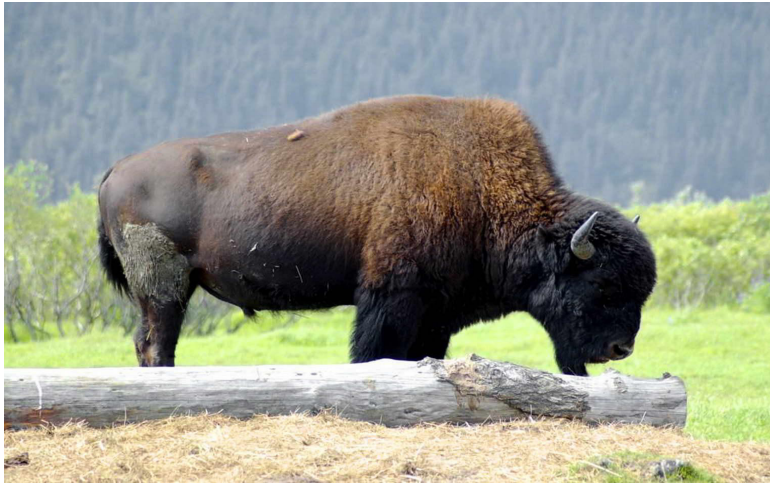
African elephants live in sub-Saharan Africa.

Albatross



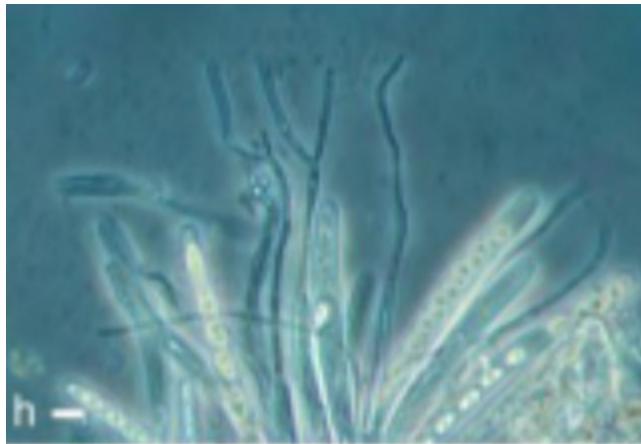
Many albatrosses are found across the Southern Hemisphere.

California Sea Lion



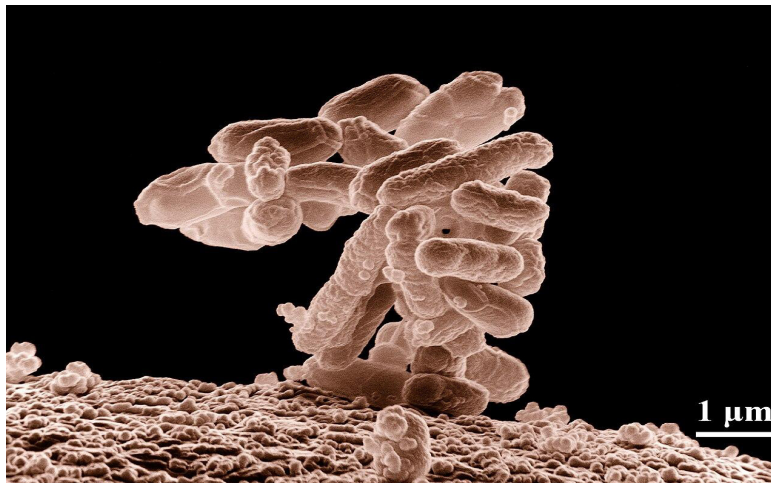
California Sea Lions live along the western coast of North America.

Polar Bear



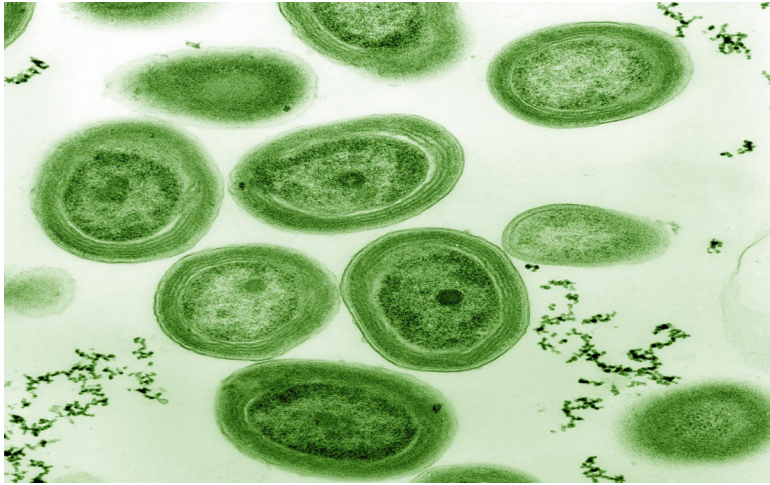
Polar Bears live in arctic regions.

Sunflower



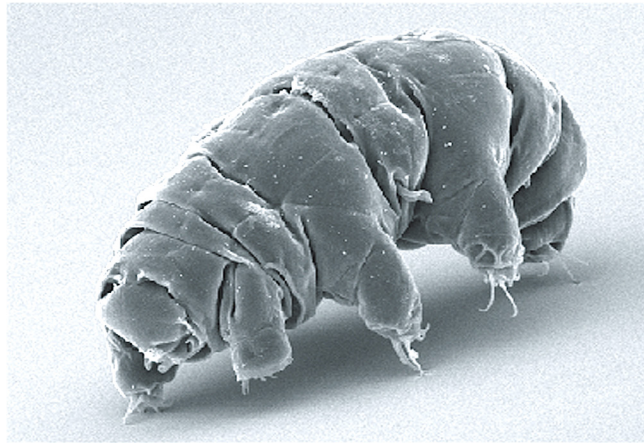
Sunflowers can be found in open fields and grasslands in North America.

Tarantula



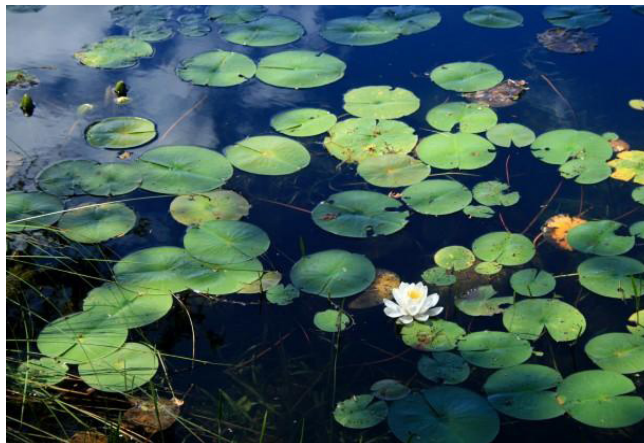
Tarantulas are most commonly found in Central and South America, as well as the southern United States.
